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### **Nuffield Science Light And Dark**

From the Nuffield foundation, this report, developed from the QCA schemes of work, is an exemplification of a pilot in which design and technology QCA unit 1A (Moving Pictures) was linked with science units 1C (Sorting and using materials) and 1D (Light and dark). Children were asked to make a collage on the theme of Christmas, and then to incorporate a simple moving part.

The Nuffield Science Teaching Project was a programme to develop a better approach to teaching

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science in British secondary schools, under the auspices of the Nuffield Foundation. Although not intended as a curriculum, it gave rise to alternative national examinations, and its use of discovery learning was influential in the 1960s and 1970s.
